


<u>President's Letter</u> <u>Issue No. 2 – 2022</u>

Perhaps like many of you, I collect books about the Pilgrims. New books...old books...kids' books. Many of these, particularly the older ones, include great illustrations. I recently purchased a numbered copy (73 of 300) of The Pilgrim Fathers, published in 1939 by the Golden Cockerel Press in London. The text by Theodore Besterman is a translation of Bradford's 1622 Mourt's Relation. The wood engravings by Geoffrey Wales (1912-1990) that illustrate the text are unique to this printing. Wales was an art teacher who accepted a low fee in order to have his illustrations published. I think they're absolutely stunning. I'm including one here.

The Warren Cousins New Website Update

The Warren Cousins new website debuted last fall at www.TheWarrenCousins.com. Since then through June 6, the site has seen 1,769 unique visitors who generated 2,179 visits. The *Homepage* was visited most, with 1,838 visits, followed by *How to Join* at 851 visits and *The Warren Family* with 403 visits. Average number of visitors each month is 240.

Facebook posts generated 934 visitors to the site, while links on The Mayflower Society website brought another 577 visitors. More than 425 visitors entered our website address directly into their internet browser. And finally, 77 visitors found the site via search engines. A total of 1,068 of visitors used a desktop computer to visit. 788 used a smartphone and 310 used tablet devices. The site is optimized for mobile devices.

While a website serves many purposes, this new site is designed to engage current and prospective members, highlight The Warren Cousins activities and celebrate the legacy of Mayflower Pilgrim Richard Warren, his wife Elizabeth Walker, their children and generations of descendants—all with a visually appealing design and easy, intuitive navigation. The Arrival of Anne – July 10, 1623 with Elizabeth Warren and her Five Daughters

In the spring of 1623 about 90 passengers embarked in two small ships sailing from London to Plymouth Colony for the purpose of providing settlers and other colony support. These were the 140-ton supply ship *Anne* and the smaller, new 44-ton pinnace *Little James* which had been outfitted for military service.

They were financed by Thomas Weston's investment group, the Merchant Adventurers, that also financed *Mayflower* in 1620 and *Fortune* in 1621. After a three-month voyage, Anne arrived in Plymouth on July 10, 1623 and *Little James* a week or 10 days later.



After this voyage *Anne* was to return to its regular cargo shipping work and *Little James* was to remain in the colony for fishing, cargo and military service. *Anne*'s master was William Peirce and *Little James* had two young men in charge – Master John Bridges, master mariner, and a novice captain, Emmanuel Altham, a Merchant Adventurer

Elizabeth (Walker) Warren and daughters Mary, Anna, Sarah, Elizabeth and Abigail sailed on *Anne* and arrived in Plymouth 399 years ago, July 10, 1623, along with a dozen or so travelers with connections to Mayflower Passengers. (Sons Nathaniel and Joseph were born in Plymouth Colony.)

In the contingent on board *Anne* were about a dozen passengers associated

in some way with *Mayflower* passengers who had come over in 1620. Some joined husbands or future husbands: Hester Cooke, Bridget Fuller, Alice (Carpenter) Southworth who married William Bradford and Barbara Standish. Another had been the spouse of a now-deceased Pilgrim – Sarah Priest Cuthbertson.

There were other passengers who married *Mayflower* passengers after arrival: Fear Brewster, Mary Becket, Christian Penn, Experience Mitchell, Nicholas Snow and Robert Bartlett, who married Mary Warren. And there were Mary and Sarah Priest, the daughters of the deceased Pilgrim Degory Priest, who had arrived from Leiden and later married Phineas Pratt and John Coombs, respectively.

Elizabeth (Walker) Warren mtDNA Update

Several matrilineal (direct female line) descendants of Elizabeth Walker, wife of Mayflower passenger Richard Warren, have taken a Full mtDNA test at Family Tree DNA (FTDNA) and all have received a haplogroup result of H1j. I had personally communicated with one of these individuals and they sent me a list of their "extra" mutations (beyond the H1j assignment). Going to the <u>YFull H mtDNA Tree</u> further defined the clade (with two of the three mutations) as H1j10a.

YFull also estimates where the H1j10a clade formed roughly 6,300 years before present (ybp) with a Time of Most Recent Common Ancestry (TMRCA) of roughly 1,000 ybp.

YFull's tree currently documents two individuals who fall under H1j10a. One individual has the flag of the U.S.A. and the other individual has no flag. What I find personally very interesting is where the four individuals (including one ancient DNA sample) who fall under H1j10 (but negative for the mutation creating H1j10a) all have the flag of Spain.



What immediately pops into my mind when I think of a Medieval period woman from Spain marrying a man from England is Eleanor of Castile (1241-1290), Queen of England as the first wife of Edward I, "Longshanks". The couple had at least nine daughters (not all surviving infancy) and a huge number of descendants. While it is sheer speculation, it is possible Elizabeth (Walker) Warren may have been a matrilineal descendant of Eleanor of Castile.

While it is impossible to trace Elizabeth Walker's matrilineal line (we don't even know the given or surname of her mother), it may be possible to discover a living matrilineal line from Eleanor and have the line mtDNA tested. A non-matching result would indicate where Elizabeth almost certainly was not a matrilineal descendant of Eleanor while a H1j10a result would go a long way toward a reasonable belief where Elizabeth may well have been a matrilineal descendant of Eleanor.

I have started tracing the matrilineal line of descent of

Eleanor of Castille (as well as her matrilineal ancestry). If you have an Ancestry account you should be able to access my public tree via: https://www.ancestry.com/family-tree/person/tree/168927233/person/112388302886/facts

This working tree is "quick and dirty" and should be taken with a grain of salt.

The Warren Cousins 2022 Annual Meeting is Friday, Aug. 12 in Plymouth



The Warren Cousins Annual Meeting features a special presentation by Plimoth Patuxet Museums' Deputy Executive Director Richard Pickering who will share an update on the new Warren House to be constructed next year and other initiatives planned at the Museum to highlight the Warren Family.

Dinner Speaker is Randall Charlton, son of Mayflower II builder Warwick Charlton, and the author of *The Wicked Pilgrim: The True Story of the Englishman Who Gave Mayflower II to America*, the true story of Warwick Charlton, his storm-tossed life in war and peacetime, how and why he built Mayflower II, sailed it to America and gave it to the American people. It is a story that involves larger than life characters, suspicion, conspiracy, deception and finally triumph against all odds!

Since the Mayflower Pilgrims' first Meetinghouse was built at the top of Leyden Street in Plymouth in 1621, a place of spiritual ministry has continued to this day. The Mayflower Meetinghouse (operated by the National Pilgrim Memorial Meetinghouse Charitable Trust) is the fifth spiritual structure built on this location and, in 2014, was added to both the National Register of Historic Places and the List of Massachusetts' Most Endangered Resources.

From the time the General Society of

Mayflower Descendants was founded in 1897, the same year the present structure was completed at the top of Leyden Street, families of descendants – our families – have made regular pilgrimages to this spot. In fact, our Mayflower descendants have helped to furnish this structure with Tiffany stained-glass

windows from the New York and New Jersey Societies, objects in the sanctuary from the Fuller Society, as well as many other contributions through the years.

To save the building they love, the First Parish Church congregation, former owners of the Mayflower Meetinghouse, agreed to donate it to The Mayflower Society upon the condition that funds be put in place to permanently maintain it, and that they be allowed to continue scheduling their services there.

The Mayflower Society will bring new life to Plymouth's Town Square at the Mayflower Meetinghouse with an immersive and multi-media museum experience. The Meetinghouse will become a vessel that pours knowledge into all its visitors as it tells the important Mayflower story. The building itself is part of the story, with beautiful stained-glass windows that depict the Pilgrims as they settled on this very location.

The sanctuary will become part of the story as it envelops visitors in a 360-degree experience. Then, an innovative and compelling group of interactive exhibits downstairs will assist in telling the story in a more personal way. A gift shop will offer museum quality items for sale and a new entry annex will entertain as guests make their way into the building.

Sydney then became a sitcom writer and worked on shows including *Major Dad, Empty Nest* and *Mama's Family*. 


